The famed psychoanalyst Sigmund Freud believed that behavior and personality were derived from the constant and unique interaction of conflicting psychological forces that operate at three different levels of awareness: the preconscious, conscious, and unconscious. Freud's Conscious and Unconscious Mind

Sigmund Freud himself published a paper in 1917, just in the wake of World War I, musing on the psychological responses to loss. In this paper, which he called Mourning and Melancholia, Freud posits that there are two different kinds of responses to loss, called (you guessed it!) mourning and melancholia.

In this paper Freud states that mourning and melancholia share common features, such as inhibition of activity, cessation of interest in the outside world, loss of capacity to love etc. One prominent factor that distinguishes melancholia is loss of self regard, which is absent in case of mourning.

Freud's own viewpoints on homosexuality varied, at times expressing biological explanations and at other times social or psychological explanations for sexual preferences. Unlike many thinkers of his time, Freud was unconvinced that homosexuality represented a pathology.

As early as 1917, in Mourning and Melancholia (1917/1980: 253), Freud was thinking about loss (in metaphoric terms) as a wound. In this essay, he states that 'the complex of melancholia behaves like an open wound, drawing to itself cathectic energies ... and emptying the ego until it is totally impoverished'.
