With the post Civil War economy in decline by the 1870s, anti-Chinese animosity became politicized by labor leader (and famous anti-Chinese advocate) Denis Kearney and his Workingman's Party as well as by Governor John Bigler, both of whom blamed Chinese "coolies" for depressed wage levels and causing European-Americans to lose their jobs.

In June of 1870, after a labor dispute between White laborers and San Francisco's local government, 2–5 Thomas Mooney and Hugh Murray—President and Vice President, respectively, of the Anti-Coolie Association—seized upon the dissatisfaction of White workers and submitted a request to the county board of supervisors for a sanitary measure against the Chinese. 6 Their request for the measure was based upon the health officer's report on Chinatown.
